2/17/24 Seed Library- A seed library is a free resource to the community, providing access to heirloom seeds! Join us for information, tips, and FREE heirloom seeds from our seed library. Please grow the seeds, save seeds from the fruits or flowers, then bring them back to the Farm so we can keep distributing seeds in the years to come! Free admittance. Stop in anytime between 12:00pm-3:00pm. **If you missed this event, come in anytime during business hours to pick from remaining available seeds.*

3/9/24 Planting Seeds with Kids- For this event, we will have several educational activities and crafts for children to learn about plants and gardening. Children will also have the opportunity to plant and take seed starters while learning how to care for the plants. Rain or shine! *FREE with park admission.* 12:00pm-2:00pm.

3/23/24 Easter Egg Decorating- Come decorate an egg with us and learn about the history of painting eggs and other Easter festivities from the 1920s. Reservations required, please call to make reservation. *\$5 per participant. Park admission not included.* 12:00pm-2:00pm.

4/6/24 Historic Oxen Farming Demonstration- Double M Farms will be bringing their team of oxen to give demonstrations of how farmers in the 1920s tended to their fields with antique farm implements. Come to learn from the past and see how oxen are still useful to small farms in the 21st century. *FREE with park admission.* 1:00pm-4:00pm.

4/8/24 Solar Eclipse on the Farm- Come for wide open spaces to view the eclipse, \$3 solar eclipse glasses (or 4 for \$10) for safe viewing (while supplies last), educational activities, and food available for purchase. *FREE with park admission.* 1:00-4:00pm **The eclipse will be at peak coverage at approximately 3pm.*

4/13/24 Class: A Hobby for the Farm Woman- Learn how to make crepe paper flowers! Even on the 1920s farm there was some leisure time for women. Experts in farm management encouraged women to take up a purposeful and enjoyable hobby. They suggested fancy work, basketry, china painting, photography, and even carpentry, upholstery and refinishing furniture! One inexpensive, popular craft was the creation of crepe paper flower decorations to

beautify the home. Reservations required, please call to make reservation. *\$5 per participant. Park admission not included.* 12:30pm-2:00pm.

4/20/24 Class: Corn Husk Dolls- Try your hand at making a corn husk doll! These dolls have been made for hundreds of years. Enjoy this 1920s tradition, learn the history of these dolls, and take your doll home with you! Reservations required, please call to make reservation. *\$5 per participant. Park admission not included.* 11:00am-12:30pm.

5/10/24 AND 5/11/24 Heirloom Plants and Native Wildflowers Sale- In partnership with the Indiana Department of Natural Resources. The Farm will be selling heirloom vegetables and herbs at the farm and the DNR will be selling native species of wildflowers and grasses from the greenhouse at the DNR Visitor Center. These gentle giants will give demonstrations of how farmers in the 1920s tended to their fields with different farm implements. 6/8/24 Family Day- Please join us for a fun filled day on The Farm! This is one of our biggest events! We will have historic demonstrations, music, games, food, horse trolley rides and more! *FREE with park admission.* 11:00am-3:00pm.

6/15/24 Photography Workshop- Calling all beginner photographers and photography enthusiasts! By the 1920s the entire farm family could enjoy the inexpensive and popular hobby of photography. Join us for a photography workshop on National Nature Photography Day with helpful instruction, history of photography in the 1920s, and a chance to practice your skills and get feedback from experienced photographers. *FREE with park admission.* 12:00pm-2:00pm.

6/22/24 Iced Tea on The Porch- Tea has been a popular beverage for centuries and the 1920s was no exception. We will be serving up different teas for you to sample. Find out what common plants can make great teas! *FREE with park admission.* 12:00pm-3:00pm.

6/29/24 Illiana Tractor Show- The Illiana Antique Power Association will be bringing truckloads of antique tractors and hit and miss engines for a big show! Step back in time and see how farm technology has changed through history. We will also have historic demonstrations of 1920s trades, live music by the Bum Ditty Barn Dance band from 12-1:30, food for sale, and games! \$5 parking, plus park admission. Proceeds from parking will benefit both local nonprofit organizations, the Farm and Illiana Antique Power Association. 10:00am-3:00pm.

7/6/24 Vintage Baseball Game- Enjoy a real, old time American classic! The McLean County Prairie Chickens of Illinois will play our community farm team, The Bo Janglers, in a 1920s style baseball game. Bleachers available, feel free to bring a camping chair. Food will be available for purchase. *FREE with park admission.* 12:00pm-2:00pm.

7/13/24 Family Garden Party- Join us for a family friendly lunch on The Farm. We will serve a buffet style lunch around the garden that will feature farm beef and pork, and fresh produce. Enjoy live music by the Bum Ditty Barn Dance band as you eat lunch! Picnic tables will be provided. Cost is \$15 for adults, \$7 kids 4-12 and children 3 and under eat FREE. Reservations required. *Park admission not included.* Rain location: the Gibson Farmhouse 11:30am-1:00pm.

7/13/24 Useful Play- Toys for Little Women- Late 19th century and early 20th century toys for children often imitated the activities of mothers and fathers. Girls learned practical skills of housekeeping by playing with toy stoves, sewing machines, and washing machines. Explore history and see examples of toys for little women in the tenant house. *FREE with park admission.* 11:00am-2:00pm

7/20/24 Concert and Barn Dance- Join us for live music by the Bum Ditty Barn Dance Band and square dance with the Lafayette Fun Squares. Then enjoy live music by Scott Greeson and Vickie Maris. Food and drinks will be available for purchase as a fundraiser for the Farm. *FREE with park admission.* 5:30pm-8:30pm.

7/27 and 7/28 Homesteaders' Weekend- The Farm at Prophetstown is the perfect setting to learn about homesteading arts and small farm animal care; after all, that's how things were done on a 1920s Farm. Join us Saturday and Sunday for classes related to homesteading. Topics will include: beekeeping, making dairy products, raising chickens, growing heirloom apples, canning, raising pigs, raising beef cattle and more. On both days we will have food available for purchase so you won't need to leave the park. Entry is *FREE with park admission*; a few classes have a small fee. 8/24/24 Square Dancing in the Barn- A local square-dancing group, the Lafayette Fun Squares, will be on the Farm sharing the joys of square dancing. They will be demonstrating and teaching some dances! So don't forget to wear your dancing shoes when you join us for this fun, interactive program. *FREE with park admission.* 1:00pm-2:30pm.

9/7/24 Apple Dumplings and a Trolley Ride- Join us for a special evening on The Prairie, complete with a warm, homemade apple dumpling. The Percheron horses will be at The Farm to pull the trolley, as you learn information about the prairie from a DNR guide. \$5 per person plus park admission. 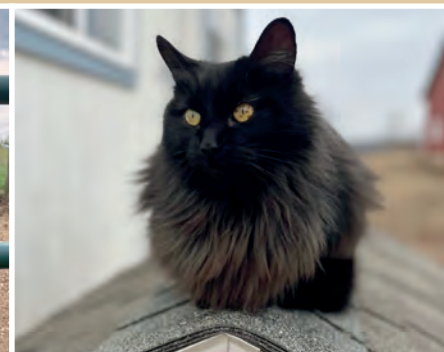
