

Farms one hundred years ago in America were still very dependent on horses. That meant, year-round constant, relentless labor. But a transition was looming on the horizon. During 1914 – 1918 food production was at an all-time high due to World War I. In the 1920s, those demands began to change and most farmers had to begin looking for ways to increase production while reducing costs.

It was a time of improved engineering of engine powered equipment, education of crop rotation, and new innovations in agriculture were starting to lead the way of a new revolution of farming across America.

When you visit The Farm at Prophetstown you will be immersed in this agricultural transformation. Enjoy exploring our museum homes, see heritage breed farm animals, and view heirloom gardens and apple orchard. Our summer events include an antique tractor and power show, homesteading arts, even a vintage baseball game and barn dance that would have provided entertainment to those of the time. Our events and programs depict the 1920s life on The Farm but also provide a basic agriculture knowledge that can be taken home and used today. Topics will include: beekeeping, making dairy products, raising chickens, growing heirloom apples, canning, raising pigs, raising beef cattle and more.
